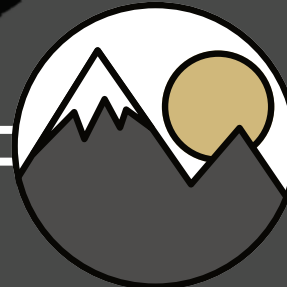

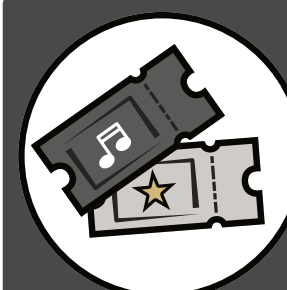
Denver is located just east of the Rocky Mountains, where the weather is generally sunny and clear. Gloomy days are a rarity in this city with 14.3 inches (36.3 cm) of precipitation and 300 days of sunshine per year. Those unfamiliar with the Mile High City may think that winters are rough, but Denver usually experiences bright-blue skies and snow that melts by noon. Seasonal average highs range from 43oF (6oC) in the cooler months to 89°F (32°C) during the summer (U.S. News and World Report, 2020).

Clear skies and an abundance of sunshine make outdoor life enjoyable all year round. Our graduate students love getting outside to enjoy activities such as camping, hunting, whitewater rafting, hiking, biking, skiing, snowboarding, birdwatching, and more!



The Regional Transportation District (RTD) provides public transportation services to 2.92 million people across six counties. Those looking to breeze through traffic and avoid parking can take advantage of the 58.5 miles (94.15 km) of light rail 29 miles (46.67 km) of commuter rail, or 2,342 miles (3,769 km) of bus routes. The Colorado A line makes getting to downtown or the airport quick and stress-free. Students looking to get around downtown can hop on the free MetroRide or MallRide, which runs continuously between the Union Station and the Civic Center. Traveling between the campuses? Look for the free intercampus shuttle - with complimentary wireless internet!
