Guidance for Participation

- The abstract "book" will be published online the week before the conference to give people the chance to peruse the talks.
- After signing into the main Zoom with the password provide by e-mail, please put your mic on "mute" unless you are speaking.
- After signing in, if necessary, modify your name in the "participants" list to show your full name so people can know who is sending messages in Chat and on screen in discussions. This is done by clicking "More" next to your name in the Participants and selecting "Rename".
- If you wish to ask the speaker a question, please put it in the "Chat" for Everyone. The Chair will call on questions in the order that they are posted and you can "unmute" to discuss with the speaker.
- It will be necessary for us to adhere to the "1 hour per session" rule. **Plenary** presenters will have exactly 12 minutes to speak with 3 minutes for questions. **8 minute speakers** will have exactly 8 minutes plus 2 additional minutes for questions.
